Instruction to Trainee

- 2. It's purpose is to evaluate the overall training of the candidate and determine deficiencies if any, so that they may be corrected.
- 3. The program director should check the logbook at least once a month so that he/she can spot any deficiencies in the training (e.g. the trainee has not rotated through the required subspecialties.).
