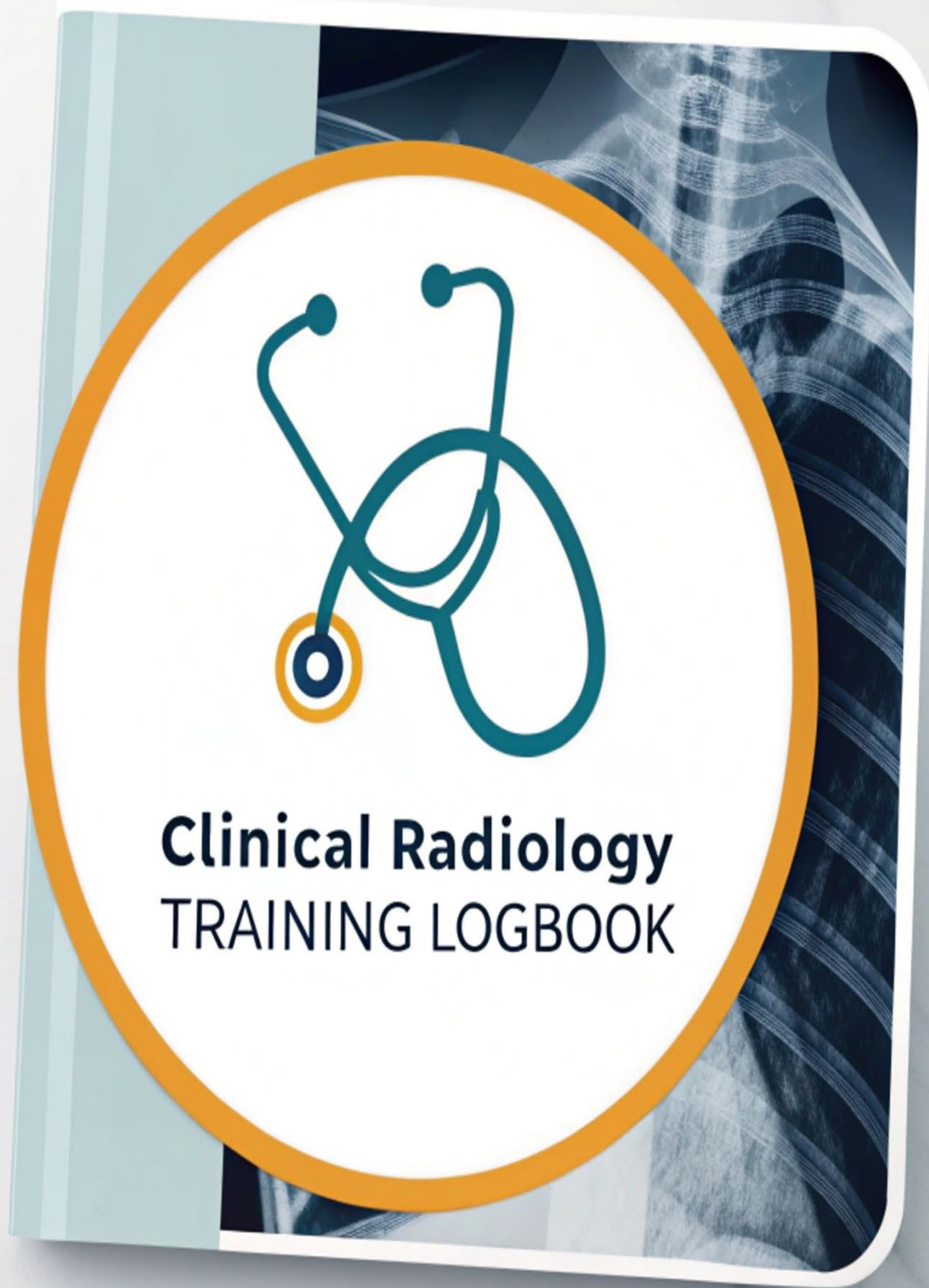






Preface

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Training Overview

The Arab Board of Radiology Training Program is a comprehensive four-year residency designed to cultivate highly skilled radiologists equipped to meet the evolving demands of healthcare in the Arab region and beyond. This program emphasizes a rigorous curriculum that integrates clinical practice, advanced imaging techniques, and interventional radiology, ensuring that graduates are proficient in both diagnostic and therapeutic applications of radiology.

Program Goals

- **Develop Clinical Expertise:** Provide trainees with extensive exposure to a wide range of imaging modalities and interventional procedures, fostering the ability to make accurate diagnoses and informed treatment decisions.
- **Enhance Technical Proficiency:** Equip trainees with the technical skills necessary to perform diagnostic and interventional procedures safely and effectively, adhering to the highest standards of patient care.
- **Promote Lifelong Learning:** Instill a commitment to continuous professional development and evidence-based practice through ongoing education, research, and participation in academic activities.
- **Foster Professionalism and Ethics:** Cultivate professionalism, ethical practice, and effective communication skills essential for collaboration with multidisciplinary teams and patient interactions.

Program Structure

Year 1: Foundations of Radiology

- Focus on basic radiological principles, anatomy, and imaging techniques.
- Introduction to clinical rotations in diagnostic radiology.
- Emphasis on patient safety, ethics, and communication skills.

Year 2: Advanced Imaging Techniques

- In-depth training in advanced imaging modalities, including CT, MRI, and ultrasound.
- Rotations in subspecialties such as neuroradiology, musculoskeletal radiology, and pediatric radiology.
- Participation in multidisciplinary case discussions and conferences.



Year 3: Basic Interventional Radiology and Clinical Practice

- Hands-on training in interventional radiology procedures.
- Increased responsibility in patient management and decision-making.
- Opportunities to lead case presentations and participate in research projects.

Year 4: Leadership and Transition to Practice

- Preparation for independent practice through senior-level responsibilities.
- Focus on leadership skills, teaching, and mentorship.

Core Competencies

- **Medical Knowledge:** Demonstrate a thorough understanding of radiological principles, imaging modalities, and their applications in clinical practice.
- **Patient Care:** Provide compassionate, appropriate, and effective care to patients, including the ability to interpret imaging studies and make informed clinical decisions.
- **Interpersonal and Communication Skills:** Communicate effectively with patients, families, and healthcare professionals, fostering collaborative relationships.
- **Professionalism:** Uphold the highest standards of ethical practice, integrity, and respect for patients and colleagues.
- **Practice-Based Learning and Improvement:** Engage in self-directed learning, utilize evidence-based resources, and apply quality improvement principles to enhance patient care.
- **Systems-Based Practice:** Understand the broader context of healthcare delivery, including the roles of various healthcare professionals and the importance of cost-effective care.

Instructions for Completing the Logbook

General Guidelines

1. **Accuracy and Honesty**
 - All entries must reflect actual clinical work performed or observed.
 - False documentation may result in disciplinary action.
2. **Timeliness**
 - Entries should be completed contemporaneously or as soon as possible after the activity.
 - The logbook must be reviewed and signed monthly by the designated supervisor.
3. **Legibility and Professionalism**
 - Entries must be clear, professional, and free from abbreviations unless commonly accepted in radiology.



Sections to Be Completed

1. Personal Details

- Complete all fields accurately (Name, ID, Email, etc.) at the beginning of training.
- Indicate the supervisor's name, and obtain their signature at the end of each hospital.

3. Procedures

- Log each type of radiological procedure performed (e.g., ultrasound, CT, MRI, biopsy).
- Record the number of procedures performed each quarter, as specified.
- Ensure numbers meet the minimum required targets.

4. Case Logs

- Document selected cases with clinical relevance or learning value.
- Each entry should include: date, case ID, type of procedure, final diagnosis and a brief clinical summary, the supervisor's remarks, and their signature

5. Candidate Evaluation Sheet

- Record the final dissensions regarding each section on the case logs based on the required procedures by the supervisor, and mention if the 3 months period include satisfactory or not.

6. Professional Development

- Record attendance and participation in workshops, seminars, and conferences.
- Include title, date, duration, and supervisor's or event organizer's signature.

Assessment and Evaluation

Trainees will be assessed through a combination of formative and summative evaluations, including:

- **Direct Observation:** Supervisors will observe trainees during clinical rotations and provide feedback on performance.
- **Competency-Based Assessments:** Trainees will complete assessments aligned with the core competencies, including written exams, oral exams, and practical evaluations.
- **360-Degree Feedback:** Input from peers, faculty, and other healthcare professionals will be collected to provide a comprehensive evaluation of the trainee's performance.
